The Veterinary Surgeons (Exception) Order 2015 states and allows for the treatment of an animal by physiotherapy but under direction and supervision and upon the recommendation of the treating vet who diagnosed the condition. 'Physiotherapist' is interpreted as including all kinds of manipulative therapy and will include osteopathy, chiropractic treatment and therefore myotherapy.

What is Canine Massage Therapy?
